





#### In Memoriam: Jon Pederson

Ion Pederson first joined the Museum Board in 2002. He played a pivotal role in the growth of the Museum as we purchased a building and hired professional staff. During a recent period of years off the Board, Jon continued his support of the Museum, helping with events, fund raising, and word-ofmouth. In January of this year, we welcomed Ion back to the Board. came with his usual infectious enthusiasm and booming voice. At our August 28 Board meeting, Jon brought a new supporter with him and before lunch was over, we had a new \$1,000 commitment towards our \$5,000 challenge

grant. With this background in mind, only 24-hours later, we were shocked to learn that Jon had passed away. What follows is the memorial that was prepared by his family:

"Jon Russell Pederson was born July 5, 1950 to Mildred (Wagner) and Rus-

sell G. Pederson of Raymond. He was baptized and confirmed at St. John's Lutheran Church and graduated from Raymond High School in 1968. To his great pride, he attended Concordia College in Moorhead until enlistment in the U.S. Marine Corps in 1970. Upon his discharge, he returned to graduate from Concordia followed by graduate studies at North Dakota State University. On May 15, 1978, he married Sophie Cropsal in Willmar and began his lifelong career at Ruffridge-Johnson Equipment Company in Minneapolis. At the time of his death, he was the CEO of Ruffridge-Johnson Equipment Company, a member of the Concordia College Language Villages National Advisory Board, a member and former Commander of the Raymond American Legion Post 420, an active Scouter and director on the Northern Star Council Board, and on the Board of Directors and former Board Chairman for Norway House. He was often described as "larger than life". He touched all our hearts and to know him was to love him. He is survived by his wife, Sophie; two daughters, Celine (and Eric) Kronback of Shoreview, Minnesota; Adele (and David) Edwards of London, England; one son, Joseph (and Helena) Pederson of Malta, New York; three grandchildren: Otelia and Guy Edwards, and Hazel Pederson. Also surviving is a sister, Debra Pederson of Chassell, Michigan along with many relatives and friends."

Jon will always be remembered and he cannot be replaced. He was one of a kind.

quired. Just show up. As always, there is no charge for Museum members to attend. Take in the world with JOTA at the Museum on October 19!




## Special Event: Get Your Car Ready to Race on Derby Night
